Note: In addition to the whitestone fragment associated with Sophia Carmichael Emmell at Site 2-1, there were two other illegible whitestone fragments, a redstone fragment with part of an inscription “JW” and “1815” legible, and two partially buried illegible redstone markers. The whitestone fragments found at Site 2-19 could be two markers or one marker and a piece of the base of the marker at Site 2-20. Three markers shown in previous Site Surveys in this vicinity but not located include Mary Emmell (1790-1859), George Alexander Emmell (1792-1822), and Harry Emmell (No Other Information Shown). The style of the Sophia Carmichael Emmell marker suggests that the missing markers of the other Emmell family members also may be whitestone. Possibly the whitestone fragments found in this Segment are pieces of the missing Emmell markers.
